years before accepting her current job as Avian Conservation Biologist at NH Audubon. She works closely with NH Fish and Game to coordinate and prioritize bird research and monitoring in the state and is

> the author of NH's "State of the Birds" report. Her interest in birds began at age 12 when an uncle took her to Brigantine National Wildlife Refuge in N.J. Pam earned a B.S. in Biology from Cornell University, an M.A. in z o o l o g y from the University of Montana, and a Ph.D. from Dartmouth College in 1995. Pam will show us some of NH's

notable species from the fascinating world of the insect order Odonata and she will share results of the "NH Dragonfly Survey," a five year volunteer-based project that documented the distribution of these insects across the state.
