

# Annual Meeting to Feature Kevin Gardner on NEW ENGLAND STONE WALLS

On **Sunday March 13th** the annual SRKGC meeting will be held in the downstairs hall of Our Lady of Fatima Church in New London. The directors are pleased to

announce that the speaker will be Kevin Gardner. You won't want to miss the chance to watch him actually construct a miniature wall as he speaks about the history of stone walls in New England.

Gardner's talk will cover a few of the main topics of his book, The Granite Kiss: Traditions and Techniques of Building Stone Walls in New England. Gardner will explain how and why New England came to acquire its thousands of miles of stone walls, the ways in which they and other dry stone structures were built, how

their styles emerged and changed over time, and their place in the famous New England landscape

A writer, teacher, and tradesman, Gardner is a lifelong resident of Hopkinton. He has spent the past thirty years building and restoring walls as part of a family business that is renowned for traditional stonework.

## **Thru-Hike Adventure**

Here's a great idea: convince four friends to join you on a thru-hike of the SRKG trail system -- 75 miles in 4 days. And why not do it in the winter when the days are as short as possible? That's the caper Wilmot resident Matt Miller dreamed up and accomplished in mid-December 2015.

Matt is an experienced hiker having completed both the Appalachian Trail and Vermont's Long Trail. Even though he grew up in Wilmot, Matt knew little of the Greenway trails. Eager to try them out he enticed some friends to join him. Hiking long days in December meant using headlamps to find their way in the early morning as well as late afternoons and evenings. They appreciated our reflective blazes and how well the trails were marked. Matt, whose trail name is Gator, is enthusiastic about our trail system. He maintains "it's the most picture-

perfect way to capture the local countryside. You've got roads and trails and wetlands and summits." Their favorite section by far was Trail 5, in Springfield and New London. Matt's group referred to it as The 10 Mile Wilderness, comparing it to the legendary 100 mile wilderness in the Maine section of the AT.
